The “Community Chalice Quilt” was constructed by several women who were taking part in a watercolor quilt class taught by myself. This group consisted of Pat MacRobbie, Linda Cherry, Carol Hess-Davis, Sylvia Watkins-Castillo, Jackie Barker and myself.

I made the quilt “Beyond the Fence” while living on Guam in 1994. My sister sent me a quilt book for Christmas '93 titled “Watercolor Quilts” and I knew I had to create one of these beautiful art-style quilts.

It is made of hundreds of 2-inch squares of fabric (after seaming they are 1.5 inches), and used to give an illusion of an object much like an impressionist painter uses dabs of paint.

I entered the quilt in an employee art contest when working for an HMO in Guam and won 1<sup>st</sup> place for the Asia-Pacific Region (the HMO was based in California). I happened to be the only contestant from the Asia-Pacific region!



After the quilt hung in our various homes for many years, I was tired of looking at it and kept it in a closet. When OUUF asked for quilts to adorn the wall and help muffle noise, I thought it would find a home.
